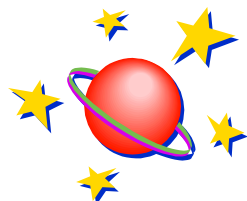

Have any Jaycee members been looking for a convenient excuse to get to the SAC museum? The "Hubble Space Telescope: New Views of the Universe?" will be at the SAC museum until April 29.

This exhibit has been organized by the Smithsonian Institution Traveling Exhibit Service and the Space Telescope Science Institute. A group 1-1 1/2 hour Hubble exhibit guided tour begins promptly at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, March 31 (meet inside the door at the main entrance of the museum to sign in). After the tour, the museum will be open until 5 p.m. for individual touring of the Hubble and other SAC exhibits. For carpooling, meet at the Country General Store (formerly known as Wheelers) at 56<sup>th</sup> & Cornhusker at 8:00 a.m. on Saturday, March 31, at the north parking lot. RSVP at the March 7 General Meeting or contact the project chairperson Kurt Meyer.



Family and friends of Jaycees are welcome. Group rates (20 or more) are \$5 for adults, \$2 for children (5-19), and FREE for children under 5. An optional Flight Simulator ride can be taken for an additional \$3 per person.

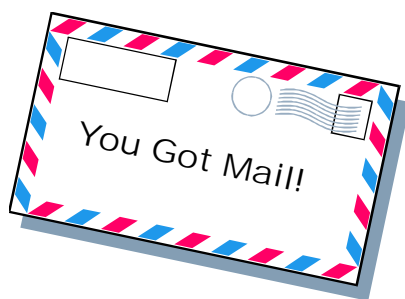
